

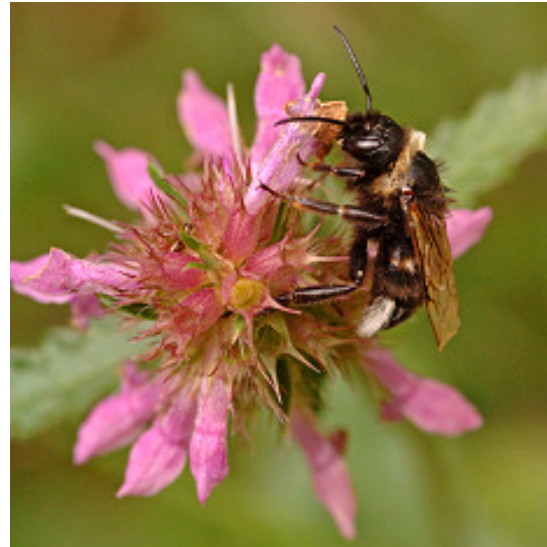
Minibeasts on the move
